Adam's Story

Adam first came to KCAH in Spring 2015 because he had lost both his job and his accommodation. KCAH staff tried to help him but initially he was too drunk to be able to consider how he might be helped. Once he had stabilised, KCAH referred him to the Joel Community Services 10-bed night shelter but this did not work out. Adam became a rough sleeper.

In February 2016, he came to the pilot Winter Night Shelter, organised by KCAH in collaboration with local churches. But, by this time, drink and drug use had taken control of his life and he was shoplifting and thieving to meet his needs.

In early spring, Adam took the brave step of telling Georgie (KCAH's Senior Housing Adviser) that he would do "whatever it took" to move on in his life.

So Georgie began searching for out-of-borough services that would meet his needs (there being no such services in Kingston) that KCAH can refer to. She identified a Community Detox Hostel that offered not just 6-9 months rehab but also the guarantee of move-on accommodation. This sounded ideal but Georgie knew that Kingston Council would have to agree to pay the costs.

Happily, the Council agreed, creating a new pathway out of homelessness for local people with alcohol problems.

Adam has now been in the hostel for two months and we are delighted to report that he is making good progress.
