Current KCAH Services

The Housing Crisis Intervention Service (HCIS) offers housing advice, welfare benefits advice and a hostel placement service. People who are homeless, at risk of being homeless or with housing issues can drop-in without an appointment between 10am-1pm Monday to Friday. Existing clients can also seen, by appointment only, between 1.30 and 3pm. Because of the level of demand, the service is not also able to deal with matters over the telephone or by e-mail . In 2014/15 a total of 450 people, mostly single people, used this service .

Through the **Access Project**, KCAH is able to house up to 37 people in its 9 rented houses for a period of up to 2 years. KCAH staff offer the tenants ongoing support with benefit claims and life skills such as budgeting and every tenant has a tailor-made Support Plan. Each tenant has their own locked bedroom and the use of shared kitchen and bathroom facilities. Some properties also have a common lounge and a garden.

Also available to all KCAH clients is the J**obClub**, which runs on Tuesday afternoons. Until recently, **football training** was also on offer on Wednesday afternoons, led by a coach from Fulham Football Club.

KCAH and the Joel Project

KCAH and the Joel Project (at St Peter's Church Norbiton) continue to work in partnership as two separate organisations. People who wish to be accommodated at Joel's 10-bed night shelter must firstly come to KCAH, as KCAH is the only The referral agency. two organisations are also in continuous conversation about effective arranging care pathways for mutual clients. We anticipate that KCAH will be moving to the St Peter's site sometime in the next 9 months.

Update on the Kingston Churches Winter Night Shelter

After consultation with church representatives in March this year, KCAH is still exploring the feasibility of a pilot Winter Night Shelter aiming to work more closely with rough sleepers who have disengaged from local services.

Rough sleepers in London double

According to Crisis, 7,581 people slept rough over the course of 2014/15 in London, a 16 per cent rise on the previous year, and more than double the figure of 3,673 in 2009/10.

Donations in 2014/15

Kingston Council (RBK): Commissioning—threat or opportunity?

Kingston Council (RBK) recently decided to replace mainstream grants with commissioning from April 2016. KCAH currently receives £60k in council grants so is now exploring alternative funding sources whilst also preparing to bid through the commissioning process.
